# PARK HYATT TOKYO



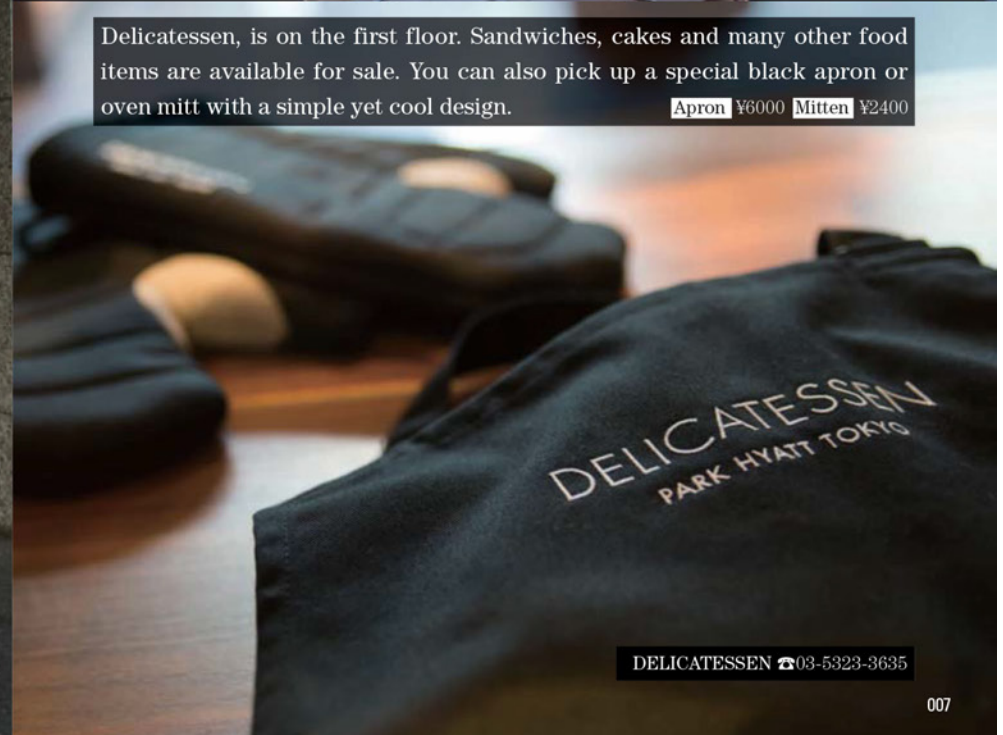
